

CLINICAL RESIDENCY IN DENTAL IMPLANTOLOGY



TINTRODUCTION T

The course will offer students the possibility to participate in a weekly session at the Master in Advanced Implantology, Tissue Regeneration and Implant supported prosthetics at the University Clinic, URJC.

The course structure will allow students that are currently under implant training or that have completed postgraduate program in dental implantology but with limited access to patients, participate in clinical sessions, treatment planning, assistance and placement of dental implants in patients provided by de University Clinic -URJC, carefully selected by the course Direction.

In addition to that, the course will offer the possibility of treating a patient provided by the participant if they wish to treat him/her under supervision.

Aims and objectives

This practically orientated course aims to provide attendants with the necessary knowledge and skills to diagnose, treatment plan and treat patients with a varying degree of complexity in a safe and predictable manner.

METHODOLOGY



Theoretical-practical course. Lectures, observation of live surgeries and different stages of implant prosthetics, implant placement on patients provided by the University Clinic, URJC, under direct supervision.




ENTRY REQUIREMENTS




